

# HOW TO MAKE DUCK TAPE EASTER BUNNY EARS



*This activity will help Beavers meet the Creative Activity Badge requirement; make a seasonal craft item.*

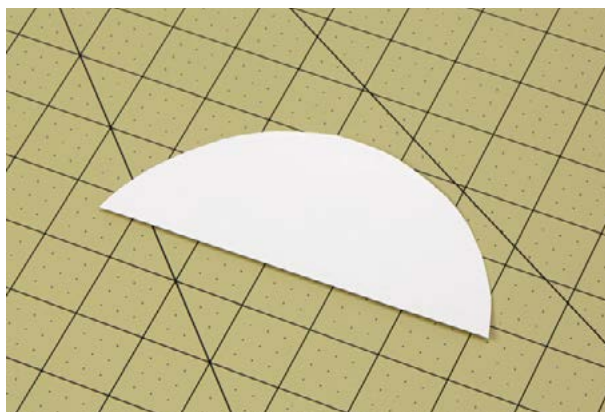
These simple to make duck tape ears are perfect for Easter egg hunts and a great project to make on a rainy afternoon. Made simply from cardboard, duck tape and a dowel, you'll have yourself a cute pair of bunny rabbit ears in no time!

**Time needed:** 30 minutes

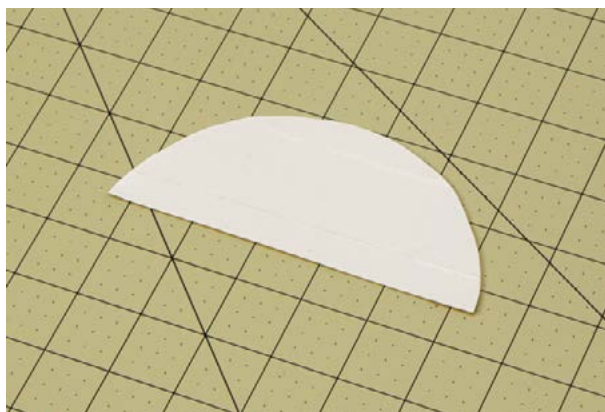
## **You will need:**

- Duck tape.
- Scissors.
- Ruler.
- Pen.
- Cardboard.
- Wooden dowel rod.
- Crafting board.

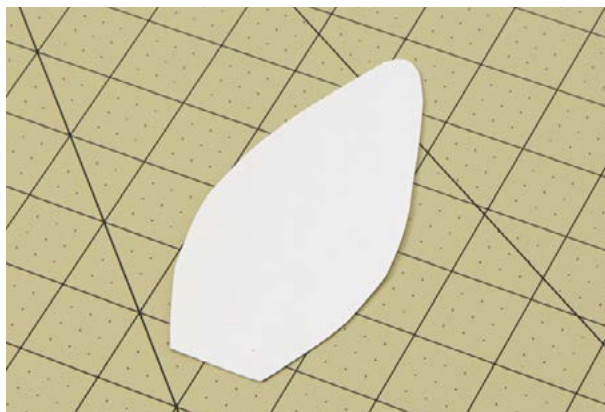
1. Draw a half circle on your cardboard that measures 15 centimetres wide across the flat bottom and seven centimetres high at the tallest point in the curve.



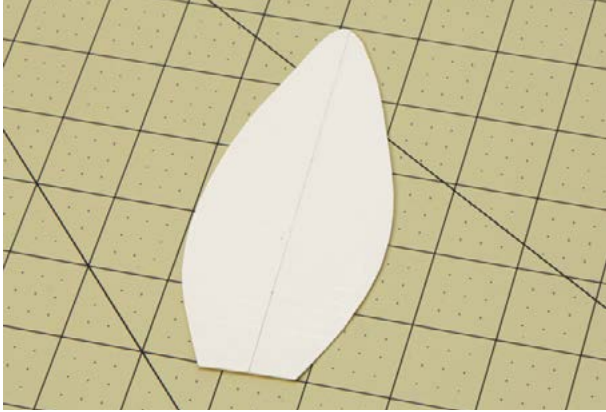
2. Cut out your half circle and cover in duck tape. Trim the duck tape to the shape of the half circle.



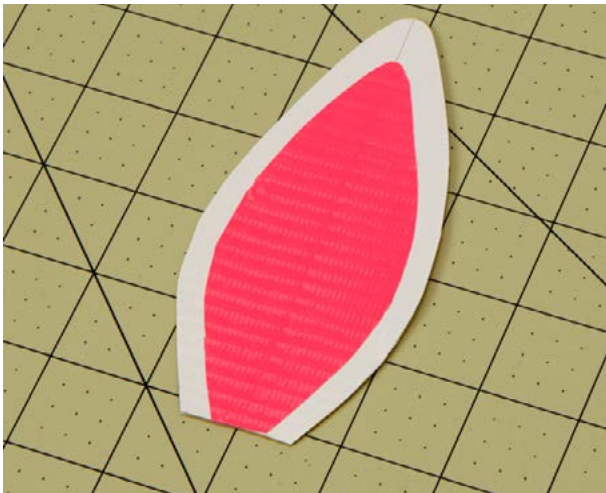
3. Draw two bunny ears on the rest of your cardboard. They should be about 12 centimetres long and seven centimetres wide. Then cut out your bunny ears using scissors.



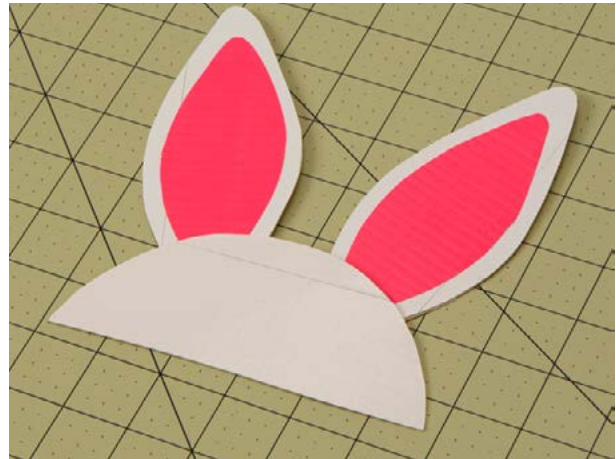
4. Cover your bunny ears in duck tape.



5. For the inside of the bunny ears draw a slightly smaller bunny ear shape on cardboard, cut it out, cover it in pink duck tape and tape it on top of the piece you made in step three and four.



6. Using a piece of duck tape, stick the ears to the top of the half circle you created in steps one and two.



7. Tape a wooden dowel rod to the back of your bunny ears.



## Top Tip

Why not have a go at making other spring masks to go along with your bunny ears? You could make a cute Easter chick or even a sheep complete with duck tape bow!
