In 1933, Carl Sterman was born to a Jewish family in Vienna, Austria. With war looming, Carl's parents sent him to Belgium. At just six years old, Carl caught the last British Red Cross train from Belgium to London, escaping the advance of the Nazis. Never a Scout as a child, he expressed his gratitude to the country that had given him a safe haven by becoming a Scout leader for many years, helping more young people to have brighter futures. Now, 70 years later, you can find Carl's name in the Promise Path at the home of the Scouts.
