



Play a fun, fruity game

Your Group can learn all about where fruit and vegetables grow

Suitable for **Beavers and Cubs+**

The aim of the game is to get Beavers and Cubs to think about fruit and vegetables and how they are grown. You can turn it into a competition by awarding a prize to the team with the most correct answers.

What to do

- 1** Divide the Group into small teams and allocate a different coloured sticky note pad to each team. On each pad you will have written the names of lots of different fruits and vegetables, keeping to one item per note. You can either make the set of words the same for each team, or to make it harder you can make each set completely different.
- 2** Stick the Farm to Fork 'Where does it grow?' images on one wall of the meeting place.
- 3** Spread out the magazines, leaflets and print outs on a table so the Beavers and Cubs can see all the different pictures.

- 4** Ask the teams to find the image of the item written on the relevant sticky note, cut it out and stick it on the note itself. If they can't find an image, ask them to draw what they think it looks like on a blank sticky note.
- 5** Once they have done this, they must then decide as a team where they think the item grows, for example in a tree, below the soil, on a bush, on a vine etc.
- 6** Once decided they need to place the sticky notes next to the relevant Farm to Fork 'Where does it grow?' image. Whichever team gets the most correct answers wins the game!

You will need

- One set of print outs of the Farm to Fork 'Where does it grow?' images (download from scouts.org.uk/eathappyproject)
- Coloured pens/pencils
- Coloured sticky notes
- Magazines, leaflets or print outs with lots of images of fruit and vegetables in them
- Blu-Tack
- Scissors
- Glue
