



CONE BIRD FEEDER

You will need: pinecones, ribbon or string, peanut butter, a butter knife, birdseed and scissors.



When the weather gets colder it can be harder for birds to find food, so why not help by making some bird feeders? They're easy to do, they look good and they're tasty (if you're a bird).

Simply take your pinecone and tie ribbon or string to the top of the cone. With an adult to help you, carefully spread peanut butter over the cone, then sprinkle the sticky butter with birdseed and hang in the garden.

If your cone is closed, leave it in a warm place until it opens!



Did you know?

Cones grow on trees and have lots of seeds inside. When the cones open up, the seeds are released on the wind and scattered all around. From these new trees can grow.
